Presentations can range from a case study the analyst or planner participated in, to a class to teach a useful skill to fellow members. In the past we have had presentations on gangs, case studies on using LPR's, and classes on Excel. If it helps with Crime Analysis, Intelligence or Planning it's a welcome topic.

GOT IT, I'M READY. HOW DO I SUBMIT MY REQUEST TO PRESENT?

When submitting a presentation for consideration please include the following items:

- **Who — Who will be doing the presentation?**
- **What — What is/are the topics that will be presented.**
- **Time — How long do you need to present? (1 hour or two hour blocks)**
- **Why — Why do you think this is important to share with your fellow members?**
